If you haven't seen any of the posts on ETC's various social media pages, the All Americans and Rouge had their first competition on November 5th at Ada high school. Both groups were excited to perform but also nervous since they weren't doing their full show. There also were some great groups attending such as Findlay, Twinsburg, Churubusco, and Grove City.

This kids performed their hearts out, and Rouge ended up winning Grand Champions in the Women's Division with Best Choreography and Best Combo!! If that wasn't big enough, they also made the finals for the entire competition, beating out numerous mixed groups to make it! It was only the 2nd time Rouge has ever made finals with mixed groups. They ended the magical day with improving their score 20 points from prelims, and got 6th place overall.

The All Americans also had a great day. They received 3rd place in their class and senior Bailey Bender won Best Female Soloist for the competition! In the end they ended up placing 3rd, making it a great start to the year!

Since then we have also had our Fall Show at Cuyahoga Falls High School, as well as the Civic Holiday Show at the Civic Theatre. The Holiday show was the first time that Main Street wore their formal costumes, and they look great!

Since the holiday season is over we are in full throttle getting ready for the big competition season. Starting in February All Americans and Rouge have 5 competitions to go to inbetween February 4th and March 18th! It will be a crazy but fun time.

Alumni Spotlight David Graham

This edition of Alumni Spotlight will focus on Alumni David Graham. David was a member of ETC his senior year in 2005 while he was a student at Firestone High School. He was the guitar player for the All Americans combo who had the slogan of "Just Unplug".

Since leaving ETC in 2005, David went on to study History/Islamic Studies/Arabic at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina. During his time at Duke he interned with the National news company in Abu Dhabi. After graduating from Duke, David moved to New York City where he wrote for the Wall Street Journal for the summer of 2009. He then became a reporter for Newsweek from 2009-2011, where his focus was on politics. While he was at Newsweek he also took a position as a contributor for the Daily Beast in politics. In December of 2011 David accepted the job as a staff writer for the Atlantic Magazine in Washington D.C. He has stayed in this role since 2011 where he covers US Politics and global news.

In this role David has been afforded the opportunity to speak on the Rachel Maddow Show, as well as have multiple other appearances on MSNBC. We are excited to see what is in store for David in his journalistic career.

ETC All Americans 1998

The 1998 All Americans was a group and year that changed the scope of ETC and is one that has become famous. It also shaped Ohio show choir in general to boost groups to become what they are now.

In 1997 the group went to Showstoppers Nashville and had their eyes opened after seeing groups such as Clinton Attache, and Cedar Rapids Washington Momentum. Watching those groups gave director Ron Jones the inspiration to push the limits of what ETC had done in the past. This was music to the ears of choreographer Mike Weaver. With this new found enthusiasm they put together an exciting new show with a great, upbeat theme, America.

While learning the show the members quickly realized that this show would be much different than years part. This one had a faster pace, crazy choreography which involved multiple lifts, tapping, and large extended dance breaks. On top of all that they were going to have a backdrop for one of the first times. To top it all off it was told that they would be doing a full costume change for the first time. But not just one costume change, there would be two costume changes! It was also one of the first years with a full student combo.

This new style was a shock to the system, but was one that paid off handsomely. In their first competition of the year the All Americans took home Grand Champions at Ada, winning Best Choreography as well as Winning their class. If you watch the tape from Ada you can see that ETC had a show that was miles ahead of the other schools in terms of choreography, costumes, and show design.

It was a historic win, as ETC had never won Ada and it was one of the first Grand Championships the organization had ever won at a show choir competition. Many of the pictures from that day have become iconic to ETC and still hang in the studio today.

From there the All Americans continued their winning ways, as they received Grand Champions at their next competition at Dover High school. They ended the year back at Showstoppers Nashville where they barely missed finals, finishing in 7th place.

The 1998 All Americans were a talented group that was well ahead of their time, and was one that will always be remembers as one of the best and most talented groups ETC has had. The year shaped a new approach to shows that ETC has used ever since and is a year that will always be celebrated.


